Talk to a doctor about non-emergency conditions, including:

- Allergies
- Bladder infection
- Bronchitis
- Cough/cold
- Diarrhea
- Fever
- Stomach ache
- Pink eye
- Rash
- Seasonal flu
- Sinus infection
- Sore throat

- When it's difficult to see your doctor
